

PGI Models outlasts web host error

PGI Models is alive and well, in spite of some recent website problems. Unbeknownst to PGI owner Mike Gossler, the web host for his site had recently by mistake listed the site as cancelled, leaving the impression to many that PGI had sold everything and ceased to exist. The website has now been fixed, and PGI continues to offer graphics, motors, speed controls, batteries, chargers, parts for RC boat racing and model kits. For those long-time followers, the old site www.scalerc.com no longer connects automatically to the new site. Jerry Courtway recovering

Jerry Courtway is currently recovering from a threehour surgery to repair carpal tunnel damage in his left hand. "They made a three-inch incision into my left palm to reconstruct the carpal tunnel area, then moved seven inches up my arm above the wrist and repaired the nerve damage they found when they did the detailed search of the arm," Courtway said.

It will take about four months to know the outcome, and it takes one month to heal one inch of a nerve surgery, so it will be another long haul.


BIG BOAT NEWS

- U-1 Oh Boy! Oberto (7,990 points) Steve David in Oh Boy! Oberto won the national high points title, and APBA's, prestigious (and newly restored) Martini & Rossi trophy for the second consecutive year. A post race physical, showed a broken fibula on David's throttle leg, sustained in the 360 degree flip.
- <u>U-3 Cooper Racing Team</u> (3,916 points) **Ed** Cooper got an early start on his season ending repairs by staying in the states as the rest of the fleet went to Qatar. The Allison-powered U-3 is currently upside down in Cooper's shop, getting "updates" to the running surfaces. Cooper also has been out and about digging up parts to build "new" Allisons.
 - <u>U-5 Formula Boats</u> (7,564 points) **Jeff** Bernard flipped in the final in Qatar, and the team has some repairs to attend to when the boat returns stateside.
- U-7 Graham Trucking (6,689 points) J. Michael Kelly could be rewarded for his UIM win with better equipment in 2010.
- <u>U-9 Jones Racing</u> (421 points) Driven by David Williams, raced only at Seafair in the Chevrolet Cup. The boat and equipment are still for sale.
 - <u>U-16 Ellstrom Racing Team</u> (7,735 points) Dave Villwock experienced a flame out in the

final heat at Qatar, toasting a turbine. The boat is getting old, and some of the advantages it once had are not the same as they were in previous years.

> ■ U-17 Our **Gang Racing**

Team - (4,584 points) Finishing the year in the cockpit for his nephew Kip Brown, Nate Brown was able to make the final heat in Qatar.



■ U-25 Superior Racing Team — (2,201 points) Ken Muscatel brought the U-25 back to Seattle for repairs sustained in Qatar. Team manager Ron Jones Jr. has brought up the name of Jon Zimmerman, to possibly drive the boat in 2010.

■ U-48 Miss Albert Lee — (4,193 points) Both of owner Greg O'Farrell's current race hulls, the U-



48 (#9698) and the U-50 (#9299) are for sale. as the team makes room for the former U-21.

■ <u>U-100 Leland Unlimiteds</u> — (4,251 points) Fred Leland has been working on the auto powered boat #9800 which last appeared as Miss Thriftway in 2005. He expects to take delivery on the three super-hemi motors in January. Meanwhile Fred is putting together his supergearbox for those three engines, while undergoing chemotherapy twice a week.

FROM THE SECRETARY: MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER MEETING

Chairman Jeff Campbell opened the meeting with 24 members in attendance. In addition to the chairman, the Contest Board for 2010 is: Secretary Rick Lentz, Treasurer/Registrar Henry Marvin, Scale Inspector Gary Simmons, Technical Inspector Mike Campbell, Race Coordinator Judy Fenton and Statistician Ben Keller.

Board members reported with information to consider for the 2010 season. Ben has completed the update of the 2009 statistics, and will be reviewing the results of vintage races where props were restricted versus open selection. He will also be working on career heat efficiency standings.

Simmons reminded that "Intent to Build" form approval is required prior to all new construction. The form will be updated, and includes the requirement for submittal of a color picture of the boat along with the form.

Technical items

Mike Campbell commented on several technical items that will be retained for this coming year. There will be no changes to the motor or battery requirements for 2010 - they remain as either the Himax 3630-1500 brushless or AstroFlight 25-5 turn motors, and 4S1P Lithium Polymer (LiPo) or 12 sub-c batteries limited to not more than a rating of 6000 mAH. Testing of motors for future consideration will continue. For 2010, the race contest director will determine whether just the carbon fiber propeller will be used for the vintage class, except the Gold Cup and the race previous will not be restricted. As a reminder, for winter storage LiPo cells should be stored at 50 percent of capacity, which would be around 15 volts.

Club finances/registrations

Marvin reported that all expenses for 2009 are paid and there's a positive balance in the club's account. The club still needs to provide stairs for the scaffolding, and asks that club members assist with this item. \$400 has been budgeted for them. Also, the motor for the chase boat needs some attention – the prop needs to be checked/cleared after each use to avoid damage. A nose wheel for the trailer would be a helpful addition. A new printer may be added, as the current one is rather slow.

New buoys will be needed for the start of the new season. Anyone interested in helping with bringing the trailer to race sites should check with Rick for scheduling. Tow money for trailer hauling will be discussed. **Ron Hornung** has prepared an extension for the chase boat to hold retrieved boats. Additional oarlocks will be purchased for the chase boat for the attachment.

A new membership form is being prepared for use in 2010, and includes a holdharmless waiver over the signature. The registration period for 2010 will commence on January 1 by mail, or at the next members meeting, and be open until January 31. Club costs will remain \$25 for membership plus \$5 per boat registered, up to the maximum of four boats. Individuals will need to secure 2010 NAMBA membership for insurance purposes. See the NAMBA website for forms to download (www.namba.com). At the conclusion of the registration period the Master Hull Roster with the build list and the address list will be updated.

Current active boats not re-registered by January 31 will be placed in a lottery to be held at the February meeting. A list of those boats will be circulated prior to that meeting it is not necessary to be present to be awarded the registration as long as a consideration request and \$5 fee has been received before the lottery date.

It was proposed to simplify the registration process by eliminating active and construction status and replacing them as simply registered for the calendar year.

The registered owner would have to complete construction and score points in at least three races of that calendar year. If the three races are not completed, the boat could be reregistered one time the following year by payment of the \$30 extension fee, similar to the provisions of retaining active status from the 2009 rules.

Tentative schedule

Fenton is preparing the 2010 schedule and list of race sites. 12 dates will be scheduled this year, with the top ten counting for season high points. Several more contest directors are needed – those interested in helping should notify Fenton of their availability and any site preferences. **John Williams** has requested some help setting up the Maple Valley Days President's Cup race.

Dates have been confirmed at Centralia and Westmoreland Pond in Portland in April, the Friday Harbor site in May and Lake Wilderness for Maple Valley Days in June. Dates have been requested for Twin Lakes, Cherokee Bay, Bellevue Pond, Lake Tye, and Tualatin, with confirmation expected after January 1.

Additional sites being reviewed include Lake Waughop in Tacoma, and a second date for Lake Wilderness, depending on cost to reserve. There will not be a fun run scheduled for January 1 this year. A spring training day will be scheduled in March. A backup date will be reserved for the end of the year, in case an event has to be rescheduled.

Trophies, etc.

The club will provide trophy plaques and tags for the top three boats in each division at each race again this year. CDs can augment awards in addition to the top three finishers

if they so desire.

Rules discussion

Several modifications to the rules were discussed, including:

- Substitute drivers can earn drivers points if they do not have an entry that day in the same class as the boat for which they are called to substitute.
- If a proposal is received, the board will review the requirement for a driver to be visible in canopy boats. This would have to be coordinated with current NAMBA requirements.

The proposed rules for 2009 will be discussed at the January 10 meeting, with formal approval to be confirmed following discussion and any further modifications. If anyone has a topic they would like the board to consider, they are asked to submit an email or snail-mail request so that some review can be done prior to discussion. Board member email addresses are listed on the website. The board typically will meet prior to the monthly member meetings.

Model show

The second annual model show for RC boats has been scheduled for Saturday, February 13 from noon-4 p.m., at the Hydroplane and Raceboat Museum. All model boats clubs will be invited, and the event will be supported by Unlimiteds Unanimous who will hold their monthly meeting and annual auction in conjunction with the show. This event will replace the February meeting, although if needed a short meeting can be held prior to the start. The cost will be \$5 per person if you bring a display, or \$10 to come and look. Everyone is encouraged to attend, along with completed models as well as works in progress. It's interesting for non-members to see what goes into the construction of RC models.

Future meetings

The remaining schedule for winter meetings has been determined. The scheduled dates will be a members meeting on January 10, the RC Show on February 13 and a Spring Training date to be determined in mid-March, the last meeting before the start of the racing season in April. All three events are great for having boat inspections completed prior to the first race, so plan accordingly.

Adjournment

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with News and Rumors. The next meeting will be Sunday, Jan. 10 at 11 a.m., at Red Dot in Tukwila.

A LOOK BACK: SEVENTH ERCU SEASON A SMASHING SUCCESS

January

At the year's first ERCU members meeting, the group decided that vintage boats must run the Graupner 45 props at the first race of the season (Champion Spark Plug Regatta) as a trial. The board would then meet immediately after the race to discuss results of the trial and determine the future of the required Graupner 45 prop. It was determined after the race that CD's would have the opportunity to decide which props would be run at each race. As it turned out, the plastic props were used at all but four races this year, and worked pretty well.

February

Our Gang Racing Team became a leader in the minds of model hydroplaners, whether they want a model of the U-17 or not. The team set an example for other teams by placing a page of detailed photos and paint colors of its boat on the website, specifically for modelers. A box on the home page of the team's website says, "New Modeler Section: Building a replica of the Our Gang Racing Unlimited Hydroplane?" If you're looking for such information, then this is the place to be to get your colors and reference pictures. With a link from the home page, visitors can go directly to the detail page.

March

Official stats from the RC Boat Show at the Hydroplane and Raceboat Museum, showed that the final numbers were better than originally expected. Two-hundred people attended the event. Ten of those signed up for \$100 museum memberships. Food sales netted

\$200 and store sales brought in an additional \$300. Unlimiteds Unanimous covered the rent fee. All told, the event raised nearly \$3,000 in total for the museum. Thanks to all who participated and all who attended.

April

Mike Campbell (*82 Executone) and Bob VandenAkker (*63 Notre Dame) opened the racing season with wins at the Champion Spark Plug Regatta in Centralia. Jeff Campbell (*69 Pride of Pay 'n Pak Hooktail) and **Mike Campbell** ('82 Executone) won the finals at the third annual Rose Festival RC Regatta at Westmoreland Park in Portland.

Mav

Bill Smiley ('71 Hallmark Homes (black)) and Jeff Campbell (driving Mike's '74 Country Boy) won the Bill Brow Memorial at Twin Lakes Park in Marysville. The rules for 1/10 scale hydro passed the national NAMBA membership vote, and the class was formally adopted into NAMBA's recognized classes. Twice in one day, Jeff Campbell snuck through final heat, final lap open doors to sweep the Diamond Cup in Friday Harbor. He won the vintage final with his own '69 Pride of Pay 'n Pak Hootail, and the modern with his brother's '74 Country Boy.

June

Ron Daum introduced his new 1957 Thriftway Too (a.k.a. "prune barge") and won Heat 3B going away at the President's Cup in Maple Valley. Speed control gremlins bit in the first connie, but the boat is very fast, very stable, good handling and well mannered. Craig Mullen (Ben Keller's '57 Hawaii Ka'i III) and Mike Campbell ("74 Country Boy) won the Presidents Cups. Mullen and Mike McIntosh ("76 Spirit of Dayton Walther) won the Seafair Trophy Race at Lake Tye in Monroe.

July

In ERCU's return to Bellevue, **Jason Hartley** won the Bernie Little Memorial vintage final with his '72 Miss Timex, while **Mike Gossler** won with his '78 Miss Circus

Circus. Both drivers won from the trailer position, and were repeat winners from 2008.

Mullen and Keller made it three out of four by winning the Oregon Emerald Cup at the Lake of Tualatin Commons, winning the vintage final with the '57 Hawaii Ka'i III. Mike Campbell won the modern class Oregon Emerald Cup for the third consecutive year with his '82 Executone. Numerous ERCU'ers made appearances at the Royal Order of The Turbine (ROTT) on the Saturday night of the big boats' Columbia Cup in Tri-Cities. Rick Lentz returned to big-boat racing when he re-joined the U-25 Superior Racing Team crew after a four-year hiatus.

August

VandenAkker snapped the three-race winning streak of Choral Enterprises Racing Team (Keller & Mullen) by winning the ERCU Columbia Cup at Lake of Tualatin Commons with his '63 Notre Dame. The modern final went to Mike Campbell with the '82 Executone. The same drivers, and boats, won the Stan Sayres Memorial at Cherokee Bay, at the end of the month.

September

For the first time in 2009, Mike Campbell brought his '68 Harrah's Club out to a race, and not surprisingly won the final at the Sahara Cup at Twin Lakes Park in Marysville. He took home both camels when all was said and done, by virtue of winning the modern final with the the '82 Executone as well. Campbell then won the ERCU Gold Cup at Lake Wilderness, too, again with the '82 Executone. The vintage class Gold Cup went to Jason Hartley, won for the second time in just his third race of the year, driving

his '72 Miss Timex.

October

Mike Campbell won the vintage final for the second time in three races with his '68 Harrah's Club, which only saw action in the season's final three races, at the season-ending Roger Newton Memorial. Jeff Campbell won the modern final with the '74 Country Boy, as a backup driver for the third time this season. On October 18, 1/10-scale racers from District 8, for the first time, had the opportunity to try out the recently adopted NAMBA rules for our class of boats. The race was put together rather quickly through the cooperative efforts of the Rose City Model Yacht Club, Puget Sound Fast Electrics, Electric Radio Controlled Unlimiteds and Classic Thunder. Choral Enterprises brought the Ka'i home to a race win in the vintage class, while Mike Campbell piloted the Harrah's Club to its third win in four races.

November

The 2009 ERCU Red Dot Championship Series Awards Banquet was again held at the Great American Casino in Tukwila, where season championships were handed out to VandenAkker (vintage) and Mike Campbell (modern). Rookies of the year were Gary Simmons (vintage) and Terry Harmer (modern). Most improved driver awards went to Mark Gran (vintage) and McIntosh (modern). The sportsmanship award was presented to Rick Lentz, and the ERCU Hall of Champions induction went to Jeff Campbell, joining Roger Newton as the first two members of this hall.

December

The new Contest Board has had their positions assigned for 2010. They are as follows: Chairman — Jeff Campbell; Secretary — Rick Lentz; Registrar/Treasurer — Henry Marvin; Race Coordinator — Judy Fenton; Technical Inspector — Mike Campbell; Scale Inspector — Gary Simmons; Statistician — Ben Keller.
