100, Leland Unlimited — Spo ing "Fred shirts" as team uniforms. Since we last checked in with you, Dave Reiser and Craig Bradshaw have both won for the first time on the Red Dot Championship Series presented by Peters & May.

Reiser drove his brand new 1982 Miss Island Security Systems brilliantly on Saturday, June 30 at the Lake of Tualatin Commons and in doing so, he won the Hobbies Unlimited Oregon Emerald Cup vintage final.

When race favorites Hawaii Ka'i III, Pride of Pay 'n Pak Outrigger (both of them) and Miss Burien all had troubles of one type or another, Reiser took advantage and led wire-to-wire, and he might have won anyway, after the near-perfect start he had.

Reiser came into the final with a heat win and two seconds, so he was feeling pretty good about the way his boat was performing. Robbie Roberts, also with a heat win and two seconds with the 1960 Miss Burien, took second in the vintage final, followed in third by Ron Daum and his 1958 Wildroot Charlie. Steve Dumanis, who had a perfect day going into the final was

Nelson Holmberg, piloting Ben Keller's 1957 Hawaii Ka'i III didn't start, after losing a rudder in the mill, while Mick Shutt's 1975 Oh Boy! Oberto and Ron Cole's 1969 Pride of Pay 'n Pak did not finish.

Holmberg ended a perfect day for his 2010 Formula Boats by winning the modern final.

Bradshaw wins Columbia Cup

Two weeks later, when the series hit Longview's Lake Sacajawea Park for the first time ever, Bradshaw posted his first ERCU win ever.

Bradshaw drive his 2010 Oh Boy! Oberto to a first place finish in that final, he scored just enough points to pull off the race victory in ERCU's only points race of the season.

Bradshaw took second place in each of the three preliminary heats and entered the final with 900 points. When all was said and done, he outscored Holmberg's 2010 Formula Boats 1,300-1,269 to win the race.

With the format being a race that's decided on total cumulated points at the end of the day, the finals still mattered after all was said and done. Bradshaw won the final, followed by Daum's 2003 Llumar Window Film, Nels Enquist's 1972 Lincoln Thrift's 7 1/4% Special, Holmberg's Formula Boats, and Shutt's 1976 Miss Vernor's. Cole's 1971 Pay 'n Pak was disqualified after hitting Bill Smiley's 1977 Charlie's Girl, which was a called dead boat. Smiley was the trailer in the final after winning

In another close finish, Smiley won the vintage race, when a tie (1,100 points) with Cole was broken by season points (which is the tiebreaker prescribed by the rulebook). Smiley also won the vintage final with his 1971 Hallmark Homes.

the modern connie.

Smiley led Cole in season points 1,991-1,950 going into the race.

Ron Cole, driving the Outrigger (right), is one of two new members who have joined the club since June 14. To date, ERCU has seen membership growth of a half dozen new members and has seen the return of a couple of members who sat out 2011.

It also means there's a heck of a race for the Rookie of the Year Award in the modern class, where as many as three drivers — Forister, Schultz and Roberts have a chance at the award.

NW H1 Unlimited races "interrupt" Red Dot Championship Series

We've entered into that mid-summer stoppage in the Red Dot Championship Series presented by Peters & May: The one we annually go into every year in order to allow our memebership to enjoy the Tri-Cities and Seattle big boat races.

This break typically lasts

for about a month, and not only provides a couple of "off weekends" so modelers can go watch the big boats while they're here in the Pacific Northwest.

That month also allows for repairs to boats that may have had a few dings, or need work to improve performance, without missing any race time.

The next race on the 2012 schedule is the ninth event — the Bernie Little Memorial, Saturday, Aug. 11 at Twin Lakes Park in Marysville.

NAMBA Regional set for August

The second leg of the 2012 NAMBA Regional Triple Crown for 1/10-scale unlimiteds is scheduled for August 26, 2012 at Cottage Lake in Woodinville.

ERCU is hosting the event. The first leg of the Triple Crown was run on March 18 at Twin Lakes in Marysville. ERCU's Nelson Holmberg won the modern class, while Robbie Roberts finished second in vintage.

The driver with the highest number of total points earned in the three races comibined, when the Triple Crown series is over will be named the NAMBA Regional Triple Crown champion.

These races use the

NAMBA 1/10-scale unlimited rules, and are open to any member of the 1/10-scale fast electric unlimited clubs in NAMBA Region 8.

The third race of the Triple Crown is scheduled for October 14 at Twin Lakes Park in Marysville. Classic Thunder is hosting the third event.
