Little hydros are a big deal in Woodland

WOODLAND – Anticipation for the new big on-the-water attraction of Woodland Planters Days built to a crescendo in the week leading up to the race.

And the actual event lived up to the hype.

With ERCU replacing a long-time waterside highlight of this town's summer festival, with the Refuge Custom Painting Woodland Hydroglobe, hundreds of people came to the side of the lake to watch the almost unbelievable spectacle of three-foot radio controlled boats racing at speeds approaching 50 mph.

No one seemed to be disappointed, as on Monday morning even the Planters Days committee vice president was sharing positive responses about the addition of the race.

While a parade wound its way through downtown Woodland, just above the park, 1/10-scale hydros were cruising a big oval course, getting timing marks and practicing for the big race. By noon, a total of 23 boats (14 vintage and 9 modern) got the racing underway and the crowds were, at times, as many as six deep along the shoreline.

When it was all said and done, the winners were a guest racer and a grizzled ERCU veteran with ties to Woodland.

Nelson Holmberg — who works at the Port of Woodland — won the modern final, his fourth race win in six races this year, with his 2010 Formula Boats, after surviving a hard charge from Craig Bradshaw's 2010 Oh Boy! Oberto when the Oberto flipped.

Second place in the modern final went to Nels Enquist and his 1972 Lincoln Thrift's 71/4% Special, followed in third by Mike Schultz's 1979 Miss Budweiser. Fourth was Ron Forister in the 1999 Miss Madison while fifth place went to Mick Shutt in the 1976 Miss Vernor's, which started as the trailer boat, Robert Roberts' brand new 2000 Znetix was unable to start. Bradshaw's Oberto and Cole's 1972 Pay 'n Pak did not finish.

Speaking of Shutt's 1976 Miss Vernor's, Shutt had perhaps the best start of the day, and claimed a wire-towire heat victory in 2B.

In the vintage class, the final was a good one. With two models of the 1969 Pride of Pay 'n Pak Outrigger – Ron Cole's (visiting from Rose City Model Yacht Club) and Steve Dumanis's – in the final, the officials were charged with keeping on their toes. Dumanis' boat made it a little bit easier when it jumped the scoreup buoy during the mill and was assessed a one-lap penalty.

When five laps were completed, Cole came out in first, followed by Holmberg in Ben Keller's Hawaii Ka'i III and Forister's 1971 Miss Madison. Sounds easy, but second and third weren't decided until the last turn of the final lap, when the Madison left just enough room in lane one for the Pink Lady to slip through and capture second place.

Fourth went to Scott Fetterly and his 1968 Miss Budweiser, followed by Jim Latimer's 1962 \$ Bill, which started on the trailer. Dumanis finished sixth and Enquist's 1959 Maverick was seventh. volume 8 | number 6 | june 2012

Dumanis win Presidents Cup at MV Smiley, bioBoatSTUFF

As the big boats begin closing out their offseason prep and get ready for the drive to Madison, the season picture is beginning to come into focus. Here are some tidbits:

U-100, Leland Unlimited - carrying on with Fred's wishes.

MAPLE VALLEY, Wash. - ERCU's ninth year as a part of the Maple Valley Days festival was a fruitful one for the club, and for Bill Smiley and Steve Dumanis.

Smiley claimed his first race win of the season, while Dumanis became the first two-time winner in the vintage class this year.

And a huge following of great spectators showed significant interest in the club and our boats throughout the day.

"perfect" days, but everyone in attendance had a lot of fun.

With 22 boats in attendance, the racing was quality with 86 percent heat efficiency in modern and 83 percent efficiency in vintage.

When it came time for the finals, only a vintage first connie was run before the winner-take-all finals.

John Earnest, who had earned a consistent day of third-place finishes in his heats with his 1962 Gale V, was the class of the field in the connie and easily held off Nelson Holmberg's 1957 Miss Wahoo. Third went to Scott Fetterly, driving the 1961 Miss Madison. Ryan Opfer was unable to start

with the 1975 Miss Vernor's. while Robbie Roberts' 1960 Miss Burien and Ron Daum's 1958 Wildroot Charlie

did not finish.

In the modern final, Smiley got a really good start in the inside lane and commanded the heat. Holmberg finished a strong second with his 2010

Formula Boats, followed by Craig Bradshaw's 2010 Oh Boy! Oberto. Fourth place in the modern final went to rookie Robert Roberts, driving his brand new 2000 Znetix, followed in fifth by Nels Enquist's 1972 Lincoln Thrift's 71/4% Special and Fetterly's 1993 Miss Circus Circus in sixth. Daum's 2003 Llumar Window Films wasn't able to finish.

The vintage final was another competitive heat with Dumanis finishing first. Ben Keller's 1957 Hawaii Ka'i III, driven by Holmberg, was second, followed by Enquist's 1959 Maverick in third. Fourth place went to Earnest's Gale V - from the trailer position. Shawn McEvoy finished fifth with Opfer's 1968 Gale's Roostertail, subbing for Opfer in the final because he drove Kerry Kjos' 1960 Miss Thriftway, which was unable to finish. Sixth place went to Smiley's 1971 Hallmark Homes after two penalties bumped him to the back of the field.

All-in-all, the day was pretty good for everyone involved and there were no accidents.

Can't ask for much more than that.

Dumanis, Campbell, Holmberg win Seafair

MARYSVILLE, Wash. – For four-and-three-quarters laps in the final heat of the Seafair Trophy Race, it looked like Mark Hansen's 1972 Van's PX would win the final at his first race of the season.

Until Steve Dumanis slipped by.

After giving chase for three laps, Dumanis took a lastgasp chance and dove his 1969 Pride of Pay 'n Pak Outrigger into the inside lane at the apex of the final turn on the final lap, stole the lead, then won a drag race to the finish.

It was an exciting way to cap off a pretty routine day of racing at Gissberg Twin Lakes Park, with a great turnout of 28 boats (16 vintage, 5 modern, 7 classic).

For the first time in club history, the modern class was split into classics and moderns – based on the new rules put in place over the 2011-12 offseason, and Mike Campbell easily won the classic championship with his 1986 The Boat, while Nelson Holmberg took the modern crown with his 2010 Formula Boats.

While there were enough boats in the pits to run a vintage second connie for the first time this year, radio troubles were such that two of them had to stay on the beach, leaving just two boats available for the second connie, which wasn't run due to not having the minimum of three boats available.

The vintage first connie was won by Bill Smiley with his 1971 Hallmark Homes. Second went to Ron Forister's 1971 Miss Madison and third was the immediate past mayor of Normandy Park -Shawn McEvoy – driving Kirk Pagel's 1964 Miss Smirnoff. Fourth went to Mike Schultz and his 1966 Miss Chrysler Crew, which started on the front line for the first time this season after completing the 1,200 point rule in the third preliminary heat of the day. Ben Keller's 1957 Hawaii Ka'i III (driven by Holmberg) and Nels Enquist's 1966 Tahoe Miss both were unable to finish the connie.

The vintage final was quite a race, with just two boats unable to finish. Second place, of course, went to Mark Hansen followed by his father, Gary Hansen, in third with the 1956 Muvalong. Fourth, from the trailer position, was Smiley's Hallmark Homes while fifth place went to Enquist's 1959 Maverick. Craig Bradshaw's 1958 Coral Reef did not finish, and Gerry Bordon's 1971 Parco's O-Ring Miss did not start, going dead just after the score up.

The classic final was also quite a race, as just one boat was unable to finish. Behind Campbell in the final order of finish was Mark Hansen's 1972 Notre Dame in second, while third went to Campbell's other boat – the 1982 Executone, driven in the final by Bordon. The fourth place finisher was Schultz with the 1979 Miss Budweiser, followed in fifth by Enquist's 1972 Lincoln Thrift's 7¼% Special. Sixth went to Smiley's 1977 Charlie's Girl.

The modern final, which marked the first time in club history a final in this class was run, was won by Holmberg with the 2010 Formula Boats, followed by Bradshaw's 2010 Oh Boy! Oberto, which completed a consistent day sweeping four second place finishes. Third went to Forister's 1999 Miss Madison, followed by the brand new 2000 Znetix of Robert Roberts and Jim Dotson's 2010 Miss Peters & May.

pecial thanks go out to Enquist for a job well done with his first-ever duty as a contest director in ERCU. The race course and pits were set up early and the day went smoothly. Special thanks, also, to Howard Price and Ryan Opfer who pulled the trailer to and from the race site, and to all of the members who helped with set up and breakdown, making both processes go smoothly and quickly.
