Henry Marvin won his first race ever, driving his 77 Squire at the Bill Brow Memorial, run May 13 at Twin Lakes Park in Marysville. Jesse Robertson won the vintage class final, driving Kerry Kjos' Miss Thriftway.

The bar for record attendance was raised at the south pond of Twin Lakes in Marysville, as 24 vintage boats and 12 modern hulls arrived at the site to be met with sunny skies (which was good) and gusty breezes (which was not so good).

To help the swelling attendance, eight boats hit the water for the first time this season, with three of those (**Rick Lentz's** '58 Miss Bardahl and U95 and **Craig Bradshaw's** '67 Atlas Van Lines) in the water for the first race ever. The veterans returning to the water wars were **Bill Smiley** 

and the '55 Miss Thriftway, **Gary Levander** with the '64 Tahoe Miss, **John Williams** with the '80 Miss Budweiser and the "71 Miss Madison, and **David Gardner** with his '74 Red Man.

Special guests in attendance were the Brow family — **Doug**, **Lisa** and son **Tyler** — who stayed for most of the day and greatly enjoyed the competition and the good times shown by the racers. Race sponsor **Steve Baker** of Seattle Service and his son **Bryce** also enjoyed the day. **Larry Hanson** of the U-6 Oberto crew (and the U-9 Jones Racing Team) made a special trip up from Auburn to watch the proceedings.

Due to the gusty conditions only seven of the 36 boats completed all of their heats, but competition was not lacking throughout the day. In spite of



Hurricane VI and Such Crust III all turned belly up from the wind, and the Madison did not finish. **Mike Gossler** with **Kirk Pagel's** Hurricane VI provided a little entertainment after it flipped and started to sink. It settled transom-first into the brine until only about four inches of bow was visible. Rather than motor out to pick it up, Mike tried the throttle, and to everyone's amazement, the boat popped out of the water and resumed running. It made a few more laps until the extra weight of the water it was carrying took its toll.

The modern connie was taken by **Jerry Johnston** and the 77 Natural Light, running in front of the Winston Eagle and the U95. Mike Gossler's 78 Squire Shop, the 71 Country Boy of **Steve Twardus** and **Nelson Holmberg** and the 73 Red Man were not able to finish.

The wind gusts took their toll on the Vintage connie, with DNFs recorded by **Jim Clark's** '67 Miss Bardahl, **Mike Campbell** and the '69 Notre Dame, **Jerry Johnston** with the Timex (with clock) and Ron Daum's Such Crust III. The heat was won by **Jason Hartley** and the Timex II, with second place going to rookie **Dawna Gross** and the Such Crust IV.

The modern final was a fast-paced event, with the Circus Circus of **Mike Gossler** catching a gust right in front of the connie winner Natural Lite, putting both boats out of commission for the heat. **Jeff Campbell** and the Pay n Pak and **Mike Campbell's** 73 Country Boy were also not able to finish, making the final order of finish the '80 Miss Budweiser in third, the '74 Red Man in second, and winning his first race ever, **Henry Marvin** and the '77 Squire.

**Kirk Pagel's** Hurricane VI was third and **Ron Hornung** driving the "Whale" Hurricane IV in fourth position with DNFs for Miss Pay 'n' Save, Miss Pepsi and Timex Clock.

The Modern first consolation was a four boat affair. Taking the win was **Mark Hansen** driving his 1972 Notre Dame with **Steve Twardus**' 1971 Country Boy second, **Craig Bradshaw** with Winston Eagle third and **Jerry Johnston** driving Natural Light not finishing.

The Vintage first consolation was a wild affair with the lead changing many times. After leading for two laps **Monte Steere's** Slo-Mo went dead and then Jeff Campbell driving **Henry Marvin's** (Red) Hallmark went silver side up after leading briefly. When the spray settled, **Gary Hansen** and Muvalong won, earning the trailer spot for the final. **Henry Marvin** with Miss Exide, **John Earnest** and Slo-Mo IV and **Jason Hartley** with Timex II finished second through fourth, respectively.

Both the Modern and Vintage finals had seven boats start and seven boats finish. This speaks well to the preparation of the boats and skill of their respective drivers to keep their charges upright and out of trouble in the confines of Bellevue Pond. These two heats truly showcased the best of the best this day.

The Modern Final was a barn burner. Between penalties and lead changes, the officials had their hands full sorting out the overall order of finish. No question about it though, **Jeff Campbell** driving his Pride of Pay 'n' Pak was first with **Mike Gossler** driving his Circus Circus a close second and **Henry Marvin** driving the 1977 white Squire taking third. Fourth through seventh were **Gary Hansen's** Miss Cott's Beverages, **Mark Hansen** and the 1972 Notre Dame, the 1978 red Squire Shop and Mike Campbell driving his 1973 Country Boy.

The Vintage final resembled the Campbell fleet on parade and was no less exciting. **Mike Campbell** driving his 1969 (Karelson) Notre Dame took first with his brother Jeff right behind with his Pay' n' Pak's Lil Buzzard. Third went to consolation winner **Mark Hansen** and Muvalong. Fourth and fifth went to **Jeff Campbell's** Hallmark Homes driven by **Mark Hansen** and Evergreen Roofing driven by **Henry Marvin. Bob VandenAkker** driving his 1966 Notre Dame finished sixth and **Jessie Robertson** driving **Kerry Kjos** Miss Thriftway was seventh.

In time for the Vintage final the winds died down to a somewhat workable level, as only two boats , connie winner Timex II and Hallmark Homes, driven by **Mike Campbell** caught the gusts. In a well-run final, **Jesse Robertson** won his first race ever with **Kerry Kjos**' 60 Miss Thriftway by edging out Evergreen Roofing driven by **Jeff Campbell** and the '68 Miss Bardahl with **David Newton**. In fourth place was the '55 Miss Thriftway piloted by **Bill Smiley** and the '63 Notre Dame with **Bob VandenAkker** steering. One special event was initiated for this race by Contest

One special event was initiated for this race by Contest Director **Henry Marvin**. Called "Hydropalooza", it featured boats trying to make the most spectacular flip (on purpose this time, not like the racing day when many must have been practicing). Four entrants gave it their all, with judging done by applause form all those watching from shore. **Henry Marvin** and the Miss Exide, **Mike Campbell** and the 69 Notre Dame and **Jason Hartley** with the Timex II all made credible attempts, but the overall winner was **Jeff Campbell** and the Lil Buzzard, who made a wild end-over-end upsidedown and backwards splash on his first run, ending up rightside up, so he restarted and did it again.

Also racing during the day was **Robbie Roberts** and the Shanty I, **Ron Hornung** with the racing tennis shoe Hurricane IV, **Ron Daum's** Miss Pepsi, **Bob VandenAkker's** '66 Notre Dame and
