Season-ending Oryx Cup is up next

WOODLAND, Wash. – It's down to your last chance to get legal finishes, make a surge in the points standings, or give it your best effort to win a race this season.

It's time for the Refuge Custom Painting Oryx Cup at Horseshoe Lake Park.

The final race of the 2012 Red Dot Championship Series presented by Peters & May is set for Saturday, Oct. 6. It'll be, format-wise, an event similar to the others we've run this season with three rounds of preliminary heats for modern and vintage, followed by connies (boat count allowing), and winner-take-all finals for both classes.

Race sponsors include Fibre Federal Credit Union, Minuteman Press of Longview, Lewisriver.com, Loves Street Playhouse and Cascade Title. Judging by the standings just released, the modern driver and boat points championships appear to be locked up, but the vintage championships are still very much up in the air, and a number of other positions in the top 10s are still up for grabs. Even awards such as Rookie of the Year, Most Improved Driver, Sportsmanship, and others could still be influenced by the final race of the season.

At around noon, we'll take an hourlong lunch break and line up all of the boats that you bring (registered in the event or not) in the park and allow spectators and members to vote on the boats they like the best in a Best of Show Contest, sponsored by Woodland's reigning Citizen of the Year, John "JJ" Burke who has provided a prize for modern and vintage best of show awards, which will be announced at the trophy presentation after all cleanup is done and the trailer is packed.

Just for fun, we'll also conduct a five lap modern exhibition after the finals, which will pit any of the boats that ran in the real Oryx Cup finals in 2009 or 2010. Of the boats currently in our club, that would include: 2009-10 Formula Boats, 2009-10 Oh Boy! Oberto, 2009 Ellstrom Elam Plus, 2010 Spirit of Qatar, 2009 Peters & May (T-4 hull), 2010 Peters & May (Leland hull), 2009-10 Graham Trucking, 2009 Miss Red Dot, 2010 Go Fast Turn Left Racing, and 2010 Great Scott. This exhibition will be limited to six boats, so if there are more than six that qualify for it, a blind draw will be held to determine the field.

ADNA, Wash. — Craig Bradshaw has found a gem of a racesite at Silverado Lake.

We're going to have to find a way to be regulars there, and we're extremely grateful for SeaTac Self Storage for sponsoring the event by paying the fees for us to rent the lake for the day.

No matter what the wind was doing, Silverado Lake was flat. Rollers from the hydros seemed to melt into the rocks along side the shore and even during the finals, with seven boats at a time on the course, it seemed like pretty good racing water.

The pit area is spacious and if the ground is dry, drivers can park their cars right in next to their pits. There's even limited power available on site if you don't want to use generators.

At the end of another really good day of racing, in the second-to-last event of the year, Ron Forister and Robbie Roberts came away as the winners of the inaugural SeaTac Self Storage Governors Cup.

Forister won the modern final after Bradshaw called a penalty on himself for lane encroachment after the final was over. Bradshaw's 2010 Oh Boy! Oberto cut off Forister's 1999 Miss Madison as the boats exited the right turn on the final lap. It was when Bradshaw was finally able to shake the Madison and finish first on the race course. The penalty was uncalled during the heat, but Bradshaw said he knew it was a penalty, and it was the right thing to do to penalize himself.

It was Forister's second career ERCU victory. Second place went to Ron Daum's 2003 Llumar Window Films. followed to the podium by Robert Roberts' 2000 Znetix, which found some excellent speed after a motor change in the pits. Fourth was Alex Daum with his 2009 Grandview on the Lake, with Nels Enquist's 1972 Lincoln Thrift's 7 1/4% Special finishing fifth and Bradshaw's Oberto taking sixth. Nelson Holmberg's 2010 Formula Boats did not finish after spinning out in the left turn apex, and being unable to get back on plane without creating a hazard on the race course for the other boats.

Roberts also recorded his second ERCU victory with a convincing effort in the vintage final. He beat Forister's 1971 Miss Madison and Steve Dumanis' 1969 Pride of Pay 'n Pak Outrigger as the top three boats. Fourth went to Enquist and his 1959 Maverick, followed by Jim Latimer's 1963 \$ Bill, which started on the trailer. Sixth place went to Bill Smiley's 1955 Miss Thriftway and Ben Keller's 1957 Hawaii Ka'i, which had been running in third for the first three laps, blew over at the end of the front straightaway and did not finish.

Latimer won the vintage connie, beating Holmberg's 1957 Miss Wahoo. Third went to Rollie Fisher's 1969 Pride of Pay 'n Pak Hooktail, with Daum's 1959 Thriftway Too finishing fourth.

Holmberg sweeps Gold Cups

KIRKLAND, Wash. — For most boat racers, the Gold Cup is the biggie they really want to win.

Even 1/10-scale racers.

And that was the case Sunday, Sept. 16 at Juanita Beach Park in Kirkland, when Nelson Holmberg completed a sweep of the Peters & May Gold Cup.

Holmberg won the modern final with his 2010 Formula Boats, then turned around and ended the day on a high note with Ben Keller's 1957 Hawaii Ka'i III, winning the vintage final.

It was the first Gold Cup for both Holmberg and Keller and Holmberg became just the fourth driver in club history to sweep the Gold Cup and the first since 2007.

Twenty five boats (8 modern and 17 vintage) made it to the pits for the Gold Cup at this new race course, on the second day of a busy two-race weekend.

Holmberg drove his 2010 Formula Boats to the race victory, followed by Craig Bradshaw, with his 2010 Oh Boy! Oberto giving the Formula an outstanding race for two laps. Third went to Scott Fetterly, driving his 1993 Miss Circus Circus. Mick Shutt took his second fourth place of the weekend in a modern final, driving his 1976 Miss Vernor's, while fifth went to Ron Daum and his 2003 Llumar Window Films. Jim Dotson did not finish the final.

In the vintage final, Fetterly led the boats into the first turn with his 1968 Miss Budweiser, but was quickly caught by the Ka'i which had the inside lane. Daum's 1957 Thriftway Too also had his nose in the early battle, as the drivers all avoided Steve Dumanis' 1969 Pride of Pay 'n Pak Outrigger, which had gone dead in the backstretch.

When all was said and done, Daum — who pushed the Ka'i all five laps — finished second with the "Prune Barge", and Shawn McEvoy finished third with the 1971 Atlas Van Lines to give Kirk Pagel his first ever podium finish. Fetterly was unable to finish, as was Rollie Fisher with his 1963 Tahoe Miss. DNS's went to Dumanis, Gerry Bordon and Robert Roberts (driving Nels Enquist's 1959 Maverick).

Daum, had earlier won the Ted Jones Memorial (a.k.a. vintage first connie, which counts as a race win at the Gold Cup), and was in the Gold Cup final as a trailer boat until Bordon couldn't get his 1971 Parco's O-Ring Miss to start. That allowed Daum to move up to the front line, and McEvoy, the alternate as the second place finisher in the connie, to start as the trailer.

Third place in the Ted Jones Memorial Monte Steere's 1956 Slo-Mo-Shun IV, while Fisher finished fourth with his 1969 Pride of Pay 'n Pak Hooktail. Shutt was fifth in the 1975 Oh Boy! Oberto and Ryan Opfer was DQ'd with the Gale's Roostertail.

Holmberg was also the fastest qualifier in the modern class, turning in a fast lap of 14.1 seconds, second in modern was Enquist's 1972 Lincoln Thrift at 16.3. Opfer tried hard to get the 2011 Miss Peters & May qualified, but was unable to get a start.

Bordon's 1971 Parco's O-Ring Miss was the fast qualifier in vintage, also with a 14.1 lap. Second went to Opfer's Gale's Roostertail (14.2), while the Hawaii Ka'i III was third (15.3), Outrigger was fourth (15.4) and Maverick was fifth (18.7).

Special thank yous go out to Dave Holley of Peters & May who walks the talk that his company supports boat racing at every level by supporting ERCU. We appreciate the support his company has provided us each of the last two years, and look forward to a long partnership continuing into the future.

Thanks are also due to all who helped make the race successful and kept it on track. Bordon, Scott & Kellie Fetterly, Shutt, Keller and Holmberg all shared the CD duties, while Shutt was also the pit boss and Robbie Roberts served as drivers rep.
