The biggest, and most sad, news of the offseason so far came in mid-December when we heard that Ed Cooper Sr. had passed away in Indiana. The man who brought the U-3 to the sport, and kept the "thunder" alive in unlimited hydroplane racing, Cooper Sr., worked hard to make sure the sport he loved remained alive for years . . . In other sad news, Llumar Window Film announced it would not continue its sponsorship of Bill Wurster's U-8 racing team into the future. Llumar's parent company is in bankruptcy, and the U.S. Bankruptcy Court is said to have something to do with the decision to not renew Llumar's sponsorship in the sport. After Budweiser left, Llumar was the longest-running contiguous national sponsor. Oberto Sausage Company now becomes the longest-running national sponsor . . . Joe Little declined the challenge issued by Erick Ellstrom for a best twoout- of-three match race between the U-1 Miss Elam and one of the former Miss Budweiser hulls. Ellstrom is said to have put up \$400,000 for the winner to take home . . . Still no word out of the Superior Racing Team shop as to whether they'll be racing in 2006, but it doesn't sound like it. In early November, word came out that the former Miss Free-I had been moved closer to the entrance of Dr. Ken Muscatel's shop, but according to different crew members, it doesn't sound like there's much action at the shop. The team's website currently has a goodbye message on it. Looks like the U-25 team really is done

. . . Why they chose Indianapolis, I suppose we'll never know (maybe to honor the Cooper family), but this year's ABRA Awards Banquet is set for March at the Adams Mark Hotel in Indianapolis. ABRA meetings will be a part of the weekend's

schedule of events.

Minutes of the January 8, 2006 Membership Meeting

Chairman **Ron Daum** opened the meeting with 28 members in attendance. The minutes of the December meeting were approved as submitted. Treasurer **Henry Marvin** reported that the balance in the club treasury is \$2319.97 as of the end of 2005. Member and boat registration forms for 2006 were distributed to the members present. By the end of the meeting there were 28 members and 50 boats already signed up for the year.

Race Coordinator **Roger Newton** reported that eight of the 12 race sites had been arranged so far, with a full schedule available for the next meeting. **Ron Daum** provided an update of the South Lake Union site.

Available dates for races have been approved for April 23, May 21, June 25, July 23 and August 27 if they are desired. The site is available for testing at any time during the year. There are pilings located along the west side of the waterway which are scheduled to be removed, possibly this spring. The course is fully usable even with the pilings in place — just don't run into them!

An order for AstroFlight motors and accessories is being prepared by **Dave Gardner**. The final order and pay-

ment will be due at the next meeting on February 12. If more than 10 motors are ordered the price will be \$125 each, otherwise the list price of \$135 will be charged.

Dave Gardner and **Mike Campbell** encourage members to bring their boats to the upcoming meetings for inspection prior to the first race. The remaining meeting dates before racing commences are February 12, March 5 and April 2.

Jim Lilly reported that the website is receiving an average of more than 300 unique hits per day over the past month. In order to keep it up to date he needs information from all of us. He can post most things but needs people to compose entries so he can post them.

Jerry Courtway has prepared several ideas for a new club logo. They were circulated for comments, and he will compress the comments into a recommendation for review at the next meeting. If anyone has any ideas please send them in for consideration before the February 12 member meeting.

Ron Daum presented the 2005 year-end award plaques to those recipients identified in previous posts.

The board is considering rule changes for the 2006 season. Ideas were presented to the membership for comments, and the recommendations will be considered in the final writing of the rules for the year.

Items under consideration for revision include elimination of the club T-shirt as a membership item. The mill start will be formalized in 2006, with a heat started by a three-minute clock and all boats required to be in and remain in motion at or before the one minute mark. A new countdown clock will be prepared. Discussion about tightening up the race day schedule included having the three-minute clock start as soon as the previous


heat is cleared, the continued use of a Pit Boss, and the need for the race CD to maintain control of the day's events.

When a racer has back-to-back heats, discretion regarding start time of the following heat will be addressed.

To encourage attendance at races and general support for the club, a minimum number of races attended will be required in order to retain individual boat registrations. The consensus of the members present was to set the requirement at two races minimum per year.







From the Secretary's Desk Rick Lentz

A one-time fee of \$30 in addition to the registration fee will be considered to maintain registration into the second year if a registered boat does not compete in its first year of registration. The registration rule may be changed to allow a member to register up to four boats in any class, instead of limiting to two boats per class. The exact wording of the battery requirements in the rules was discussed and tabled pending further study.

Race ČD's will be encouraged to take more control of their race during the day. Assigning turn judges and qualified

referees for the heats will remain the responsibility of the race CD. A referee training session was suggested, and will be considered.

Jim Clark is completing a speed control order, and needs orders and payment by January 14 to assure the discount price of \$85, instead of the regular price of \$100 plus shipping.

The club-approved li-po batteries should be available at the February 12 meeting for those who pre-ordered them.

A performance standard for motors will be reviewed to see what is/will be available if the current AstroFlight motor is no longer available. This will not be a concern for the 2006 racing season, so there will be no modifications to the required motor for this coming year.

It will be the intent of the study that any new motor proposed will match the specifications of the current motor so a wholesale change-out will not be necessary by any member.

Note the date and time for the next meeting. Because of the Super Bowl being scheduled for February 5, the meeting and Swap Meet date has been moved to Sunday, Feb. 12. The Swap Meet will start at noon, break at 2 p.m. for the members meeting, and resume afterwards, running until 5 p.m. or as commerce dictates. Reminders will be sent out periodically.

Following Show and Tell, the meeting was adjourned. A special thank you is extended to all who brought a boat(s) to the meeting. It makes it fun for all to see works in progress and to have examples and ideas available. All are encouraged to continue to bring boats for Show and Tell to every meeting.

Columbia Division nearly ready for some racing

The New Year is a good time to report that there's activity in the Columbia Division.

While we're still not quite ready for our first race, we are ready for some playing. And as all of you guys up north know, we already have one pretty strong boat in our fleet with **Kerry Kjos's** Miss Thriftway.

As the year begins, we've got five boats that are ready to run, one that's nearing completion, and as many as three others that are in the planning or construction phases.

Most of us are from the Portland area, with a couple of guys from Vancouver, and all but one of us have experience running the gas boats in R/C Unlimiteds.


